## CGST busts ₹48 cr fake ITC racket

The Central Goods and Services Tax (CGST) department has exposed a racket involving fake GST registrations and bogus input tax credit (ITC) claims worth Rs48 crore in Palghar. This comes as part of a nationwide drive against shell companies, with authorities busting 70 firms on Friday.

The action followed a similar operation on October 10, when the CGST anti-evasion unit uncovered another Rs44 crore ITC racket in Borivali. The mastermind behind that scheme, who had been operating 22 shell companies, was arrested.

In the latest case, the GST authorities employed advanced analytical tools, which led them to the 70 shell companies while investigating an earlier fraud involving Rs59 crore. In that instance, three people had already been arrested.

During a search operation against M/s Mad's Packaging, which ran 70 dubious firms across Mumbai and Pune, officials uncovered fraudulent ITC claims totalling Rs48.08 crore, linked to fake invoices valued at Rs320 crore. The firms had claimed Rs22.28 crore in ITC and passed on Rs25.80 crore in fraudulent credits.

A GST official said that the mastermind created these shell companies solely to issue fake invoices, allowing ineligible ITC to be claimed and passed on to other firms, all for a commission.



## Man hit while crossing road

A 45-year-old man sustained injuries after being hit by a truck in Bhiwandi on Tuesday. The incident occurred on Bhiwandi-Kalyan road near Sai Baba temple when the victim was crossing the road. After the accident, the truck driver fled the scene, leaving the victim without providing any medical facilities or informing the local police. Later, the police team reached the spot and shifted the injured to the hospital.

## 7-yr jail for sex assault

The Thane Session and Special POCOSO court sentenced a 41-year-old man to seven years of imprisonment for abducting and sexually assaulting a minor girl in Thane. A case was filed against Ganesh Patil by the victim's parents in 2022 at Mumbra police station when the parents learned about it. Special POCOSO court Judge Dinesh Deshmukh sentenced Ganesh to seven years of rigorous imprisonment and a fine of Rs10,000 for the same charges.

## One held for killing driver

The Kogaon police arrested a 35-year-old man for allegedly killing auto rickshaw driver Dinesh Ganpat Bhoir, 45, over an old fare dispute in Bhiwandi. The incident occurred at Rajnoli Naka on Thursday around 6.30pm. Four days earlier, Bhoir and the accused had a heated argument, which escalated into a scuffle. Seeking revenge, the accused posed as a passenger and allegedly slit Bhoir's throat with a sharp weapon at an isolated area.

# Ulwe police station gets a nod from MHA

The proposed Ulwe police station finally received approval from the Home Ministry on October 10. In light of the growing population and increased pressure on the NRI Coastal, Nhava Sheva, and Panvel City police stations, Navi Mumbai Police decided to establish an independent station for Ulwe, submitting a proposal

accordingly. Ulwe, with a population of approximately 160,000, houses large urban developments and projects, including railway stations. The area's rising population has led to an increase in crime, straining the current police stations. Additionally, the Coastal Road, connecting Atal Setu and Shivajinagar to Navi Mumbai International Airport, has boosted traffic. As a result, residents face challenges with complaints,

passport issues, and character verifications, as the area currently falls under the jurisdiction of multiple police stations, according to a notification issued by the Home Ministry.

Earlier, the Director General of Police (planning and coordination), Maharashtra, proposed dividing the NRI Coastal, Nhava Sheva, and Panvel City police stations to create a new, fully equipped Ulwe police station, with an estimated cost of Rs212 crore. Deputy Commissioner of Police (headquarters) Sanjay Patil said that the existing

staff will be deployed at the new station, and they are finalising the jurisdiction before submitting a proposal to the Home Ministry. Navi Mumbai Commissioner of Police Milind Barambe, said, "A ground-breaking ceremony at CIDCO-allotted plot 76 in Sector 10B of Ulwe is being planned, and a temporary location will be arranged for the station until the permanent facility is built".

# Child custody battle takes a gory turn

A woman's throat was slit by her husband in broad daylight, minutes after she left the Naya Nagar police station in Mira Road on Friday afternoon. The man has been arrested and booked for murder. The woman was visiting the police station regarding her minor son's custody, which had been granted by the court.

The estranged couple - victim Amreen Nadeem Khan and husband Nadeem Ahmed Khan - was entangled in a marital dispute over domestic violence and their two-year-old son's custody. Amreen had moved the district sessions court, Thane, under relevant sections of the Guardians and Wards Act, 1980.

The court had directed the police to provide adequate protection to ensure that no obstacles are created by the opposite party in the hand-over process. Amreen had gone to the police station on Friday seeking intervention.

Social activist Dr Suresh Yewle, who happened to be at the police station, said, "I noticed the woman sitting in the waiting area awaiting her turn to meet the senior police officer. When I spoke to her, she narrated her ordeal, following which I assured to help her out. However, when I

came back, she had already left. A few minutes later I learnt that she had been brutally attacked near NH High School. Had the police shown some sensitivity in the matter, the gruesome incident could have been averted."

Refuting the allegation as vague and baseless, DCP (Zone 1) Prakash Gaikwad said, "After receiving the order, we promptly provided police protection to the woman to get custody of the child. Our team had gone to their apartment on Thursday. However, neither he nor the child were present at home, so our team had to return empty handed."

"After leaving the police station, the woman had apparently gone to meet her elder daughter at the nearby NH High School, where the accused accosted her and slit her throat with a knife," DCP Gaikwad said. The woman succumbed to her injuries, the accused was caught by locals and handed over to the police. He later claimed that his family, including the child, had gone to Ajmer.

# Retd couple to get house at 1995 cost

The State Consumer Dispute Redressal Commission has admitted a case despite a 22-year delay in filing it, citing a "continuous cause of action" against a builder and his partner. The case, filed by a retired couple - Ajit Ganpat Kurlye and Anagha Ajit Kurlye - was against M/s Saraswati Builders and its partner Pradeep Nandlal Gupta, for failing to deliver possession of a flat booked in 1993. The commission not only admitted the case but directed the duo to hand over possession at the originally agreed 1995 price, and awarded additional compensation.

The Kurlye couple had booked a 525 sq ft flat in Prem-Nagar Complex, Kharegaon, Kalwa, after retirement on paying an initial sum of Rs500 in 1993. They later issued a cheque of Rs42,000 on November 12, 1993, followed by an advance

cash payment of Rs1.05 lakh, for which they were not given a receipt. Despite entering a formal agreement on January 26, 1994, with the promise of possession by March 1995, the builder and his partner failed to register the sale agreement or deliver the flat. The complainants repeatedly approached the duo, who assured them the delay was due to litigation. After years of waiting, the couple filed a complaint with the consumer commission in 2018.

The builders' lawyers argued that the complaint was barred by limitation, given the 22-year delay in filing. They noted that under the Consumer Protection Act, cases must be filed within two years from the date of cause of action, and no formal request

had been made to condone such a long delay.

However, the commission ruled in favour of the complainants, stating that the builders' failure to register the agreement and deliver possession was a "continuing cause of action", thus keeping the claim alive. The commission cited Section 4 of the Maharashtra Ownership Flats Act (MOFA), 1963, which imposes statutory obligations on developers, and held that the violation of these obligations made the complaint within the permissible time limit.

The commission ordered the builders to hand over possession of the flat within 45 days at the agreed-upon 1995 rate. Additionally, they are also directed to pay Rs1.5 lakh compensation for mental anguish and Rs50,000 towards litigation costs. Should the flat be unavailable, the developer must provide an alternative flat of the same size in the same vicinity under the same terms.

# State's 'broken promises' to preserve rich Urdu language

## Unfulfilled promises

- 2012, MU announced plans for Urdu Bhavan
- 2014, BMC released funds to start Urdu Ghar
- Land allotted at Bandra Reclamation for Urdu Ghar, later given to private company
- Urdu Sahitya Akademi not given awards for last 3 years

Urdu speakers and groups have drawn attention to the neglect of Urdu Ghars created by the Maharashtra government a decade ago to promote and preserve the language. They have charged the government with neglecting Urdu Ghars and other institutions in the state.

The condition of the Urdu Ghar in Solapur, one of three built so far, shocked Farid Khan of Mumbai-based Urdu Carvan when he recently visited the place for an event. "I was excited to visit an Urdu programme. What I saw was depressing. There is a good building but no team to run the place. The library has large cupboards but no books. I was told that Rs15 lakh have been sanctioned for the centre but the money was not disbursed. There is an auditorium and conference rooms but it is not used," said Khan who has informed the Minister for Minority Affairs, Abdul Sattar, and Member of Legislative Assembly from Mumbadevi, Amin Patel, about the sorry state of affairs.

Other Urdu organisations said governments have fooled Urdu speakers by promising support and later ignoring their. "We endorse the complaint. For instance, land was allotted at Bandra Reclamation for an Urdu Ghar. That promise has not materialised. The government promised an Urdu Learning Centre in Agridada. The project was stopped after protests by Bharatiya Janata Party legislators. These are cultural centres. We want these institutions to be built," said Zubair Azmi of Urdu Markaz,

which organises the Bhandi Bazar Urdu Festival.

Khan said that of the six promised Urdu Ghars, earlier called Urdu Bhavans, only three have been constructed, with no plans for the remaining centres, including one in Mumbai. He said the government has been spending money on expensive events purportedly to promote the language. "However they have failed to create institutions that can have a more enduring role in preserving and popularising the language," said Khan who gave the example of the 'Dastan-e-Dakhan' organised in Sambhaji Nagar (Aurangabad) last week. "It was largely boycotted by the public who were angry that the government has done nothing to stop religious leaders like Ramgiri Maharaj from defaming Prophet Muhammad (PBUH)," said Khan.

The Maharashtra Rajya Urdu Sahitya Akademi, established in 1975, has not given awards for the last three years, said Khan who added that there have been four ministers in charge of the subject in five years.

## Call centre busted, 14 held in Malad

The Mumbai crime branch's Unit 8 has busted a bogus call centre that was allegedly defrauding hundreds of investors across the country under the pretext of forex trading. The police have arrested 14 persons, including the kingpin Amar Pareira, 35.

On October 10, police sub-inspector Vikas More received confidential information that a fake call centre was being operated by Contic Infotech Company at Chincholi Bunder Road, Malad West. The centre allegedly collected personal information of targets through the online 'Match Trader' application. They were then called through an online application, claiming to represent the VFX Markets brokerage firm from the United Kingdom. The scammers allegedly lured investors into trading by promising guaranteed and high returns from investments in the forex market.

Initially, the platform provided to the investors would show profits, but later the fraudsters would extract more money from them and eventually show losses, using the investors' money for their personal gain, the police said.

During the raid, two laptops, 16 desktop computers, two mobile phones, and other incriminating documents worth Rs2,40,500 were seized.

A case has been registered at Malad police station under various sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, the Indian Telegraph Act, the Information Technology Act, and the Maharashtra Protection of Interest of Depositors (In Financial Establishments) Act.

## Man dies at police stn, kin say assaulted

A 28-year-old man collapsed and died at the Jogeshwari police station on Thursday after visiting to file a complaint about unpaid wages involving his employees. However, Deepak Jadhav's sister has accused the police of beating him, leading to his death.

The police have denied the allegations, claiming that Jadhav went to the restroom, became unconscious, and collapsed. A police officer said, "We immediately took him to Trauma Hospital, Jogeshwari East, around 2am. He was alive when admitted, but the doctor declared him dead at 4.45am. There were no marks found on his body." The police mentioned that five to six other people were present at the station, providing statements for unrelated cases at the time.

# Rumbling roads give sleepless nights to Belapur citizens

Thousands of Belapur residents, including school-going children of Ekta Vihar, central government employees' colony and Nilgiri Gardens, are facing a tough time crossing the road in front of their buildings following the removal of speed breakers by the Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation (NMMC).

The speed breakers have been replaced with rumblers, which are not effective in slowing down vehicular traffic. Additionally, noise pollution has increased tremendously adding to the woes of residents. There is continuous passage of heavy vehicles including big containers along this stretch that goes towards NJPT and Uran Phata. As per residents, the rumblers have been ineffective in reducing the speed because of which residents, especially school students, are

finding it very difficult to cross the road. The rumblers are not marked, there is no zebra crossing and no warning signals, which green signals the drivers to drive rashly.

The residents have demanded the civic body to reinstate the height of the original speed breakers near the main gates of both colonies to ensure their safety. The Secretary of the Central Government Employees Welfare Association Ekta Vihar CGS Colony, CBD, Belapur Anuj Kumar Pandey said he has already met Sanjay Patil, deputy engineer of NMMC on several occasions and briefed him about the hazards being faced by the residents but rued "there hasn't been any fruitful outcome".

Residents hope that the civic body will take immediate steps and ensure the safety of the residents in order to avoid any untoward incident.
